

Project Readiness

Requirement	
Scope	Detailed scope required (including plan view/typical section concepts).
Cost Estimate	Engineering cost estimate.
Scoring	Detailed scope scored based on detailed LRTP goals and objectives.
Environmental/ Planning Analysis	Requires letters of support from facility owners and resolutions of support from local municipalities.
Operations & Maintenance	Ongoing operations & maintenance must be identified.




